L[&]RCAA



Classification Badge Scheme – Information

Any archer may be awarded the badges of a lower class at the same time as a higher one, eg. if you make 2nd Class you can claim 3rd Class at the same time, just send in the documents for the 2nd Class score. See information below for requirements to be met for each classification badge. **Badges are free to all L&RCAA affiliated archers.**

Badges will be awarded on the lines of the Archery GB classification system. All scores must be shot under Archery GB Rules of Shooting. Open Shoots/Tournaments may be in any County or Region, unless specified. **County Classification Badges can only be issued by the County Records Officer.**

When submitting a claim for any classification badges the following must be enclosed:-

- For Club Target Day rounds a copy of the original score sheet endorsed by a Club Officer "Certified shot on a Club Target Day under Archery GB Rules of Shooting and entered into the Clubs Records Book".
- For Tournaments/Open Shoots a copy of the results sheet.
- For MB and GMB a copy of the Archery GB confirmation of the claim.
- The Classification Form fully completed.



3rd Class

All three rounds may be shot on a Club Target Day, or at any Tournament/Open Shoot. All must be 3rd class or above.



2nd Class

Two rounds may be shot on a Club Target Day, the other one round to be shot at a Tournament/Open Shoot within the County or County organised shoot. All must be 2nd class or above.



1st Class

One round may be shot on a Club Target Day, the other two rounds to be shot at a Tournament/Open Shoot **one of which must be within the County or County organised shoot**. All must be 1st class or above.



Bowman

All three rounds to be shoot at a Tournament/Open Shoot, **one of which must be within the County or County organised shoot**. All must be Bowman Class or above.



Master Bowman (MB)

All three rounds must be shot at events organised by WA, WA Members, Archery GB or at a UK Record Status meeting. The only qualifying rounds are York/Hereford & WA Gents/Ladies.



Grand Master Bowman (GMB)

All three rounds must be shot at events organised by WA, WA Members, Archery GB or at a UK Record Status meeting. The only qualifying rounds are York/Hereford & WA Gents/Ladies.
